CURRENT CLASSES

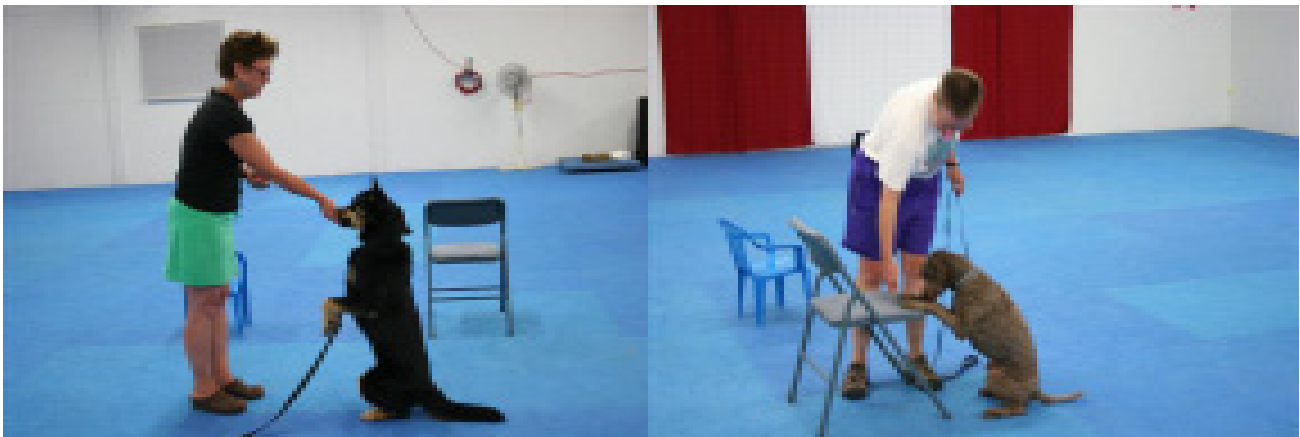

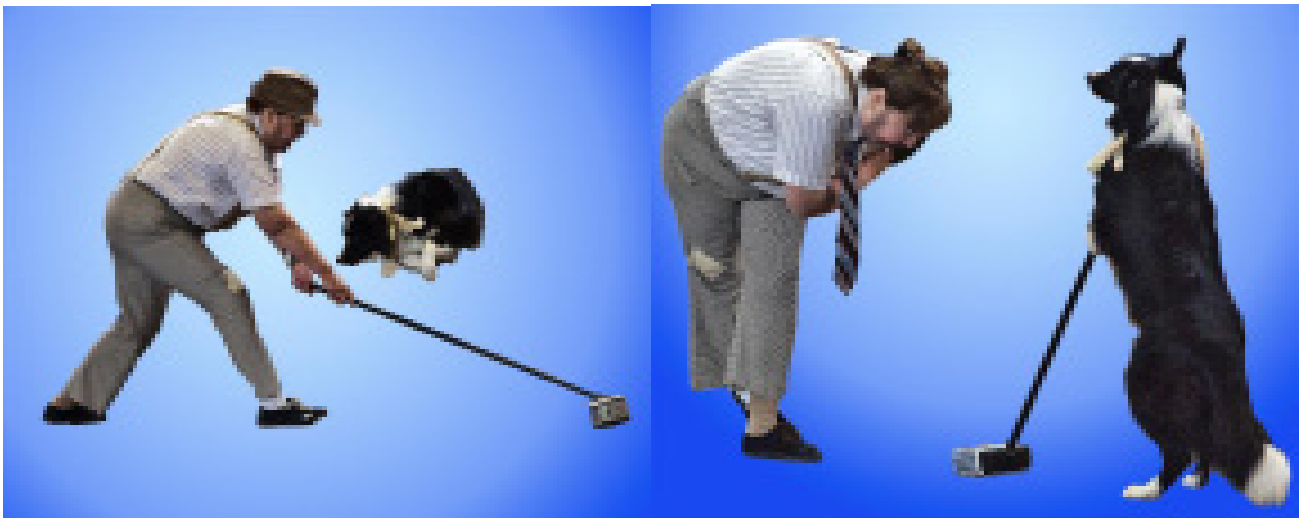

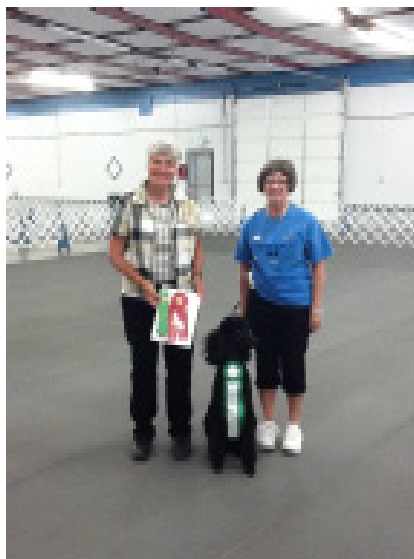

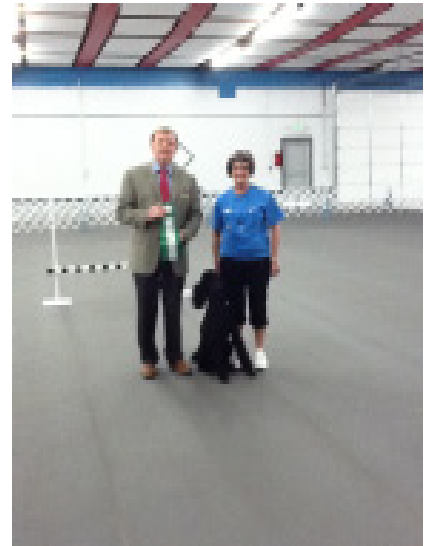
